From the time we got on the bus to the time we went through check-in in Rochester to get to Telluride, everyone was excited.

Upon arrival at the Telluride Lodge, lift tickets, and unit keys were distributed. After unloading the bus and getting settled in our condos, we were calmed by looking up the mountain and seeing “snow”, lot of snow! Everyone stretched his or her legs and the next stop was to the on-site grocery store and package store.

On Sunday, most of the group went up to the mountain. There was a chair lift (#7) about 200 yards from our home. Also available was a free shuttle available to take people to the gondola to get to the slopes or to wherever they wanted to go. The area had been blessed with three feet of snow prior to our arrival. The lift lines were short and the slopes sparsely populated which made skiing even more delightful. There were trails for every level of skier. Galloping Goose, a “green” cruiser from 11,850 feet to 9540 feet, is about 4.6 miles long. The experts had their blacks, double blacks, and double black X trails at 12,225 feet! The intermediate skiers had an amazing number of runs. The views from the top were awesome, the weather wonderful.

The restaurants at the slopes and in the two villages offered a wide variety of food selections, priced from reasonable to “high end”.

On Saturday we loaded the bus and said goodbye to a wonderful week of skiing.

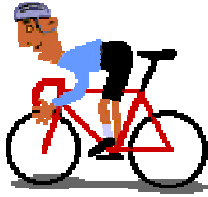
Short Bike loop

BD: 20 mi. DD: 40 mi. Difficulty: Easy

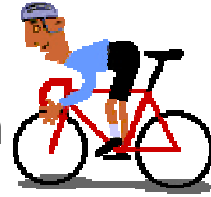
Long Bike Loop

When we are done and all packed, we will head back to Barneveld to Vans Tavern for some after trip stories, cold beer, and some of their Saturday food specials.
