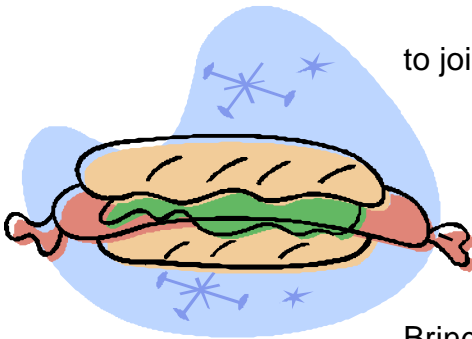

****Note --** The water station is on Whitesboro St at the corner of Chery St in Utica. It is right across from the fire house and just west of Heintz funeral parlor. (west is towards Yorkville) Volunteers are asked to be there between 6:00 and 7:00AM (about the crack of light) to help set up and are requested to stay until the end to help take down. Parking is limited and some roads are blocked off earlier than need to be (some rent-a-cops don't have any flexibility). Some parking is available at the water station or in Heintz's lot or you can park on Erie St and walk up Kernan Ave. The 5K Race officially starts at 7:30, wheel chair at 7:45, and main race at 8AM.

The July Camping Trip is At Lake Eaton State Campgrounds Near Long Lake. The campground offers a Sandy beach with Picnic Area, Hot Showers, and Boat & Canoe Rentals. Located in The Central Adirondacks, there are many lakes available for kayak/canoe trips including Long Lake, Little Tupper and Lake Eaton itself. Nearby are the Adirondack Museum in Blue Mtn Lake (www.AdirondackMuseum.org or Ph # 518/352-7311) and the Wild Center Natural Museum in Tupper Lake (www.wildcenter.org or 518/359-7800) for rainy day activities. Motor Boats are allowed on the lake. Lake Eaton is about 2 hrs north of Utica off of St Rte 30. Take Rte 28 north thru Old Forge, at Blue Mountain Lake turn left onto Rte 30 and Continue . Andy's ski tips.

Now that spring is here and the golf clubs and kayaks are out, you should not forget about your ski equipment just yet. You should wash and put away all your ski clothes, preferably in one spot, so they are ready in the fall for that Thanksgiving dump. You won't be running around in a panic wondering where your long under wear is.

You should take the liners out of your boots to make sure they are dry and no science project is growing in or on them. When dry and clean put them back in the boots, clean off your boots with a damp cloth to get all the grit and grim off, buckle the boots and put them in a dry, room temperature place (your attic or cellar is not that good, too hot, too damp). Take you skis and wipe the tops off with a damp cloth to get the road salt and grime off. Do the same with the bindings then maybe lightly spray some WD-40 on them to protect them from moisture. You should put, rub or hot wax, some wax on the bottoms to keep the air from the P-Tex and oxidizing them (when they start to look white and chalky).

This should help you be ready in the fall when you put the golf clubs and kayaks away and, hopefully, start praying for snow.
